LOUD:

Street noise Sudden sounds Heat pumps Voices Computers whirring

BRIGHT: Fluorescent lights Flashing lights Neon signs

OVERSTIMULATING: Strong smells Crowds Uncomfortable clothing Temperature changes

Everyone experiences sensory sensitivity at times. But for many autistic people, sensory overwhelm can be a daily experience. It can make everyday activities like attending school, going to the supermarket, working in an office or going to a movie feel impossible.

On Wednesday the 10th of April - this coming Wednesday - to stand together with our Autistic community, Ashgrove students can wear a HOODIE of their choice (over the top of their uniform). **THIS IS NOT A MUFTI DAY** - uniform is to be worn with the hoodie.

We will also be taking part in a nationwide 'quiet hour' on this day.

SIGNING IN AND OUT OF STUDENTS & VISITORS / PARENTS / CAREGIVERS TO THE SCHOOL

- 1. When a student arrives late to school for any reason, they must go to the office and sign-in on the tablet.
- 2. When an adult visits the school for any reason, they must also sign in using the tablet to record their time in and record the time out when they leave.
- If you are collecting your student due to illness, an appointment, or need to take them home early, the student must be signed out in the tablet by their caregiver/ parent and ensure that the teacher knows you have picked them up.

Whenever possible, please advise your child's teacher and the school office in advance of pick up.

This system is for your child's safety and ensures we know where all students are at all times. It is also part of the safety procedures required for fire drills or lockdowns.

If you are picking your children up from school or have given permission for someone else to collect them, you / they will need to come into the school to collect them.
